

## About This Database

This database consists of two parts. Part One, *A Guide to Parliamentary Records in Monarchical Egypt*, provides practical information for the use of parliamentary records in monarchical Egypt (*Madābit Majlis al-Nuwwāb and Madābit Majlis al-Shuyūkh*, 1924-1952) at the Institute of Oriental Culture (IOC), the University of Tokyo. This was originally published in the form of a book with CD-ROM, as a product of Arab Group of Contemporary Islamic Studies Project of the Toyo Bunko in 2007. Part Two, *The Whole Text of Parliamentary Records in Monarchical Egypt*, gives the image data of the entire volumes of Parliamentary Records that the IOC holds (the text of *Majlis al-Shuyūkh* will be added later). I wish that this database would contribute to promoting historical studies of modern Egypt.
